Dear Christ Church parish family,

We are about to begin the brief season of Advent. As the prayer above says to well, Advent is a season of spiritual preparation through reflection, prayer and repentance. We are called to examine our lives honestly and see where we have allowed the "works of darkness" to take up residence in our minds, hearts, souls, thoughts, words and behavior.

This season of repentance has two focal points: Christmas and Heaven. In the short run, we are preparing spiritually for the annual celebration of Jesus' birth — when he "came to visit us in great humility". In the long run, we are preparing for the time when Jesus "shall come again in glorious majesty" in his eternal kingdom of life. In other words, Heaven.

I realize that this traditional season of reflection and repentance seems to be a contradiction of the season of celebration that December is for most people in our society. But it need not be so. There is joy to be found in letting go of negative thoughts, words and actions which contradict our faith in a good and loving God.

So, I invite you all to take time every day in this Advent season to read the scriptures and examine your life and pray for the strength to "lay aside the works of darkness" that have invaded your life.

We will be focusing on this theme in our Advent Sunday sermons under the heading of "Prepare the Way of The Lord". I invite you to read the Sunday scriptures and meditate on them in your daily prayer during the week.

I wish you a blessed and Christ-centered Advent and Christmas.

Advent Sermon Series: "Prepare the Way of the Lord"

Here are the sermon themes and scripture lessons for each Sunday in Advent. You will get more impact out of the Sunday sermons and scripture lessons if you read the scriptures during the week after and ask Jesus what he is saying to you personally.

December 1 1 Advent

"Strengthen your hearts in holiness"

Jeremiah 33: 14-16; 1 Thessalonians 3: 9-13; Luke 21: 25- 36

December 8 2 Advent

"He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion."

Malachi 3: 1-4; Philippians 1: 3 – 11; Luke 3: 1-6

December 15 3 Advent

"Bear Fruit That Befits Repentance"

Zephaniah 3: 14- 20; Philippians 4: 4-7; Luke 3: 7-18

December 22 4 Advent

"My Soul Magnifies the Lord"

Micha 5: 2-5a; Hebrews 10: 5 – 10; Luke 1: 39-55

If you are feeling more ambitious, you can read one chapter of the Gospel of Luke each day during Advent. There are 24 chapters in Luke. If you read pone chapter each day, you will read the entire Gospel by Christmas Eve.

If you are feeling more ambitious still, you can pray Morning Prayer, Noon Prayer, Evening Prayer or Compline or the shorter daily devotion services every day in December.

You can find them on pages 37 to 146 in the Book of Common Prayer. If the range of choices seems overwhelming, just pick one simple service and stay with that.

The important thing is to set aside time and place to pray and seek our the person and word of Jesus in your daily life.

Medical Mission Trip To Nigeria: Great Success

All Thanks to the Outstanding Support from Christ Church Members

Thank you Christ Church Members for your generous donations, your moral support and your prayers for the medical mission in Port Harcourt, Nigeria.

Because of your generous donations, we were able to serve 1,621 people with free medical care: that total includes 115 surgeries, 326 eye care patients, 121 dental patients, 157 lab tests and 1,360 people who received spiritual / emotional/ marriage and family counseling.

The total cost for purchasing medicine, medical consumables, transportation, food, and lodging for all of the volunteers was about \$17,000. Christ Church members contributed more than half of that otal. We could not have reached this many people without your ge

Kateri Medical Services, which was founded by Fr. Tom in 2002, builds and runs full-time medical clinics (9 so far and one in the planning stages) all over Nigeria. These clinics run 364 days per year. And we charge patients about \$1 for a child and \$2 for an adult to see a doctor. And the patients must pay for their own medicine. Even these low rates are out of reach for many poor families.

Every year, we do special fund raising to do one week free medical missions. And we work with another organization called FaithCare (1) which brings volunteer surgeons to do complicate surgeries that our clinic staff are not trained to do.






Many children receive surgery for hernias and in this case a life-saving appendectomy. (6)

Thanksgiving is over, and now we are on to the Christmas season. It's such a happy time because we see family and friends, and we celebrate the birth of our Savior. For me, it's a happy time, but it's also hectic. Hectic is different for everyone. For me, it means chocolate making, craft making, cookie baking, parties, work (can't forget work), and presents to buy and wrap. I know this is the way it is for many people, and although it is very exciting, it can also be a time of depression and anxiety. I know that at times, I push myself too much in an attempt to make Christmas special for my family and friends. I am sure all of you do the same thing.

I am asking that this year you reflect more on the reason for the season, and less on all the stressors of the season.

"For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).

Take the time to pray, read about the birth of Christ, attend the church events that reflect on Jesus' birth, spend an evening listening to Christmas music, and lean on the Lord and family/friends when you need help. If you need extra help during this Christmas season, call a friend, a family member or your church family. God loves you more than you will ever understand. Lean on him and know he hears you.

Find a mantra that soothes you and memorize it. Use it when you need to decrease your anxiety about everything going on. Lastly listen to a song that reminds you that you are ok, and all will be ok. In case you couldn't tell, music is very important in my life. I listen to mostly Contemporary Christian music, and I draw a lot of my strength from the music and the messages they give me. Google the song "Still Waters (Psalm 23)" by Leanna Crawford. It's a beautiful song and a reminder that God is always with you. This is the beginning of the song:

Great Aunt Maurine said at a hundred and three Write scripture on your heart for when you need it Cause anxiety hates Psalm 23 So just say it to yourself 'til you believe it And I'm feeling like I'm needing it right now

The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want He leads me by still waters 'til my fears are gone Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death O I know You are with me My father, my friend Your goodness and mercy will follow me all of my days I know by Your still waters I'm safe

Lord I believe You can set me at ease Turn this broken piece in me to peace and quiet I know there's power in Your word So I'll say it over and over til my soul's reminded





Christ Church has a long history with Lincoln School. We began our outreach mission with Lincoln in 2015. Our first initiative Megan's Mittens provided winter gloves to every third-grade child in Warren's four elementary schools. Then we began collecting gently used and new clothing. Next came the donation of food to help stock Lincoln's Food Pantry shelves primarily jars of peanut butter and jelly.

Over the years it was food to stock the pantry shelves, today it is providing emergency food bags. The weekly numbers grew from 25 to 50, today it is 100. The bags contain a macaroni and cheese cup, a spaghetti cup, a package of ramen noodles, a package of peanut butter crackers, a drink box, a fruit cup and a Rice Krispie treat. A student named the food bag a Happy Bag. There was a smile on her face.

The stories shared by the Community Liaisons are heartbreaking. A shared story – a young girl came up to the Liaison and said to her "I am hungry" and then put her arms around the Liaison and started crying.

A Happy Bag includes a Macaroni and cheese cup, a Spaghetti cup, a package of Ramen noodles, Peanut butter crackers, a Drink box, a Fruit cup and a Rice Krispie bar.


This is a parish wide community event, and we need a lot of helpers. This is your contribution to the church and we are so thankful to those of you who can help. This is what we need in addition to the cookies:

- 4) Cleanup after the reception.


